In early August, Sonko and his friend Travis traveled to Kenya for 3 weeks to do some important work for Olalo (meeting the students currently sponsored through Olalo and those kids who are finishing primary school and need sponsors in order to begin Secondary School in January), to coach at the Oyugis Soccer Academy and do some work to improve the soccer field.

Sonko arranged meetings with all the parents/guardians of Olalo's students to talk about the responsibilities the students have as recipients of school funding. He encouraged them to monitor their kid's school work to be sure they were following through with what was expected for continued support. We place a very high value on our donors' support of a child's education, and it's important that the student also put value into it by good attendance and grades, and the desire to achieve the best they can to lead to a better life.

Since Sonko and Travis both coach at the **Portland City United Soccer Club**, they wanted to spend a lot of time coaching at the Oyugis Soccer Academy, and they did!

They brought with them eight huge suitcases filled with donations of soccer balls, shirts, jackets and cleats. Our own **Portland Timbers** donated over two hundred shirts which the kids were thrilled to get as you can see....They replaced Kenyan soccer balls made of plastic bags and string with donated ones from Portland, and passed out cleats to the kids still playing soccer in bare feet.

Bringing the donations cost an additional \$200 for each suitcase, so it's difficult to take donations over



He's just 8 years old. Recently he lost his little brother to disease when they could no longer afford the medication, and now he was sick...and for some reason, no longer able to walk. His parents took him to a local doctor who advised them to see a specialist over 100 miles away.

Basically he told them to do the impossible!

While Sonko was in Kenya he heard about "Ken," the eight year old who was ill and now lost his ability to walk. He visited with the family and then called Olalo to see if we had the funds for Ken to see the specialist. We did.

It's been a few weeks and the report is Ken is walking again!

We are waiting to hear exactly what happened with this little guy, but unfortunately we didn't hear before newsletter time...but we will keep you posted.

Early in Sonko's trip to Oyugis in August, he called about a young boy who was injured with possible internal bleeding and needed funds to take him to the hospital for x-rays and evaluation.

Olalo's Change for Change Medical Fund was able to cover the \$22 it cost and he was taken to the hospital and treated.

We posted the situation on Olalo of Hope-Kenya's Facebook page and since then many have asked about him.

Here he is, home and doing well!

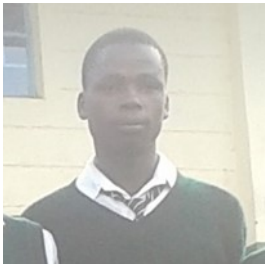
We are grateful for every baggie, jar, coffee can, envelope and cup we receive filled with someone's pocket change!

The new school year is approaching and we still have lots of kids who need sponsors to start Secondary School in January. Here's just a few of who's waiting.....

Wycliffe (Wiki) Ochieng – DOB 12/25/98 Wycliffe lives with his parents. He says *“I’m thankful for your support you gave me in my studies, may God award you more for that. My parents can’t believe your good doing for me....”* Wycliffe want to study to become a lawyer or counter. (accountant?) He attends WIRE Secondary School and will begin his 4th year in Secondary School in January. Olalo has supported Wycliffe since 2013.



Calvin Ochieng – 15 years old. Calvin lives with both parents. He is the youngest of 5 children and the very first able to attend Secondary School with Olalo of Hope's support. Calvin says of his parents, *“They were very courages (encouraged) about the future gain.”* He says he will work hard for B+ grades and A's to become a lawyer” Calvin attends WIRE Secondary School and will begin his second year of Secondary School in January.
