It's all about the antibiotics....

Olalo of Hope-Kenya, through its Change for Change program - YOUR donations- has provided the funds that enabled many children and adults afflicted and suffering from malaria or typhoid to seek medical help and receive life-saving antibiotics.

Malaria

According to the Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI), malaria is the leading cause of morbidity and mortality in Kenya. It is transmitted through infected mosquitoes. The most vulnerable groups are pregnant women and children under 5 years of age. It is estimated that 20% of all deaths in children under the age of 5 is due to malaria. It is attributable to 30-50% of all outpatient medical visits and 20% of all admissions to health facilities. A child dies every 30 seconds in Kenya due to malaria.

The treatment for malaria is antibiotics.

Typhoid

Typhoid is also common in Kenya. Bacteria which causes typhoid is found in untreated water and food. Raw fruits and vegetables and shellfish are the types of foods most often associated with the illness. Flies may transfer the bacteria to food. Left untreated, typhoid fever is a grueling illness that may progress through various stages and lead to death within one month. Children are the most vulnerable to contracting typhoid, though many adults contract it also.

The treatment for typhoid is antibiotics.

More than half of all the children and adults Olalo has been able to help through Change for Change were treated for malaria or typhoid...some with just the medication, others through hospitalizations.

It's your pocket change that is making a difference! Next time you empty a food container or fruit jar or coffee can, don't throw it away! Leave it on your kitchen counter as a reminder to toss your pocket change in it and you just may help save a life.

Education

The emails arrive in the middle of the night....filled with dreams of a better life. They are the applications of children who have goals and dreams of breaking out of the cycle of poverty by getting an education

The new school year has begun in Kenya and early mornings emails arrive with new applications for tuition assistance to begin or continue their education into Secondary School.

- ***Fifteen year old Victor wants to become an optician when he finishes school
- ***Fourteen year old Geoffrey, who lives with his mother, wants to become a doctor
- ***Jared, age 16, wants to focus on good grades to someday attend University to become an engineer
- ***Rodgers, 13, desires to help educate others and become a lawyer after school
- ***Sixteen year old Florence wants good grades to fulfill her dream to become a doctor

These are just some of the goals and desires of kids whose dreams will never be realized without an education beyond primary school. Olalo of Hope - Kenya now holds the dreams of over 20 kids waiting for tuition/education assistance.

We've Double In Size...but have a long way to go!

In 2013 when Olalo of Hope-Kenya became a reality, we were able to fund six students in Secondary School. In 2014, we have already doubled that number and are currently supporting 12 students.

Some of our students are sponsored by individuals or families, the others are funded through donations to Olalo of Hope-Kenya with the direction for the money to be used wherever it is most needed. These funds are usually divided between educational and medical needs.

Our students are attending the Wire Mixed Secondary School, Omboga Mixed Secondary School and Agoro Sare Mixed Secondary School.

There are still many children waiting to be able to attend Secondary School, and many more will be ready for the next school year.

We are blessed to be able to send these 12 to school...12 young people with hopes and dreams of a better life through education.
